

SUMMARY OF THE DECEMBER SESSION MEETING

- Chapel Hill Treasurer Gary Dickerson went over the proposed 2024 budget; after some discussion, Session voted to approve the 2024 budget. Session sincerely thanks Gary and Kaitlyn Dryer for all the work that went into preparing the budget.
- A discussion took place during the Pastor's report regarding continuing communion with the prepackaged communion cup/wafer or to move back to pre-COVID style communion with bread and individual cups. The conclusion at this point was to continue with the prepackaged cup/wafer, and poll the congregation in the future to see if people feel comfortable going back to the pre-COVID method of communion service.
- Building & Grounds is now working through a heating unit on the roof which is not functioning properly. There is a fix available, which would be a stop-gap measure. The better option is to replace the unit so it will not fail for many years. Building & Grounds is working on pricing, a timeline, and the most effective solution.
- Session is looking forward to the Christmas Eve worship service. Ross Dryer will be in attendance and will accompany Paula Isgrig for "O Holy Night".
- Christian Nurture will be taking the youth to the Parkville Living Center for a service project on Martin Luther King day in January, where the youth will participate in building projects and assembling kits for soldiers.
- Karl Morrison, Tim Deveney, Becky Carle, and Carrie Gautsche rotate off Session at the end of December, and we thank each of them sincerely for all the work they put into their ministry units. What an outstanding group of Chapel Hill folks they are!



Hillcrest Transitional Housing, a non-denominational organization, now has 90 units in the Greater Kansas City area in which clients can reside. These are in both Missouri (where 27% of homeless persons are unsheltered) and in Kansas (where 29% of homeless persons are unsheltered).

Clients may be homeless individuals, families including infants, and unaccompanied youth. Hillcrest Transitional Housing's proven 90 day and youth programs move clients from homeless to self-sufficiency.
